Introduction

The Directors, who are the charity trustees for the purposes of Charity Law, have pleasure in presenting their annual report and accounts for the year ended 31st December 2016.

The directors are satisfied with the performance of the charity during the year and the position at 31st December 2016 and consider that the charity is in a strong position to continue its activities during the coming year, and that the charity's assets are adequate to fulfil its obligations.

Objectives and Activities of the Charity

Summary of main activities of the charity in relation to its objects

The objectives of the charity are to advance the education and participation of young people in Scotland in creative expression, including but not limited to music, art, writing and dance, as well as sport by providing and assisting in the provision of tuition and facilities (not required to be provided by the local education authority) for such education and participation.

Summary of main activities of the charity in relation to its objects (cont)

Falkirk Area

Larbert High School, Kiran's former secondary school, continues to be an outlet for Kiran's Trust to support creative arts education. Four school prizes are awarded each year: creative design, music, photography and creative writing. A three year scholarship is also awarded to support a creative design/art pupil (monies increase each year through to sixth year with the potential to assist if students go on to study design/art at college.) The third scholarship has completed with the individual continuing her education in art, therefore receiving the graduate payment. The fourth scholarship has been awarded to a fourth year student.

Support was continued for Carrongrange School, as well as seven primary schools in the area.

Delta Studios joined forces with Forth Valley Sensory Centre to provide a blind sculptor with focused tuition. He also interacted with the younger students giving them insight into what it was like to be blind and artistic. This joint effort will continue in 2017.

Central Taekwondo Academy, where Kiran trained and competed, is where we support young people in their advancement in the sport of Taekwondo. The giving programme changes made in 2015 worked well for all involved and continue as a devloping scholarship, sponsorship of the Cadet and Junior Teams, and an ambassador role. The Kiran Martin Indomitable Spirit Prize is awarded annually to recognise an individual committed to the sport of Taekwondo but who does not participate at a competition level.

Fife/Pittenweem Area

Pittenweem Primary School awards an annual prize for the most creative pupil to a student selected by school staff.

Edinburgh Area

The giving programme grown in 2015 has devloped into core support in 2016. Kiran's Trust agreed a sponsorship deal with the Edinburgh International Magic Festival (EIMF) to be their charity partner for the Magic School. This has proven an excellent opportunity for young people to express their creativity and have fun in the bargain. Edinbourgh Young Carers Project (EYCP) continued to avail themselves of this opportunity, as well as a donation of Lego and Lego Technic sets. Our friends at bia bistrot ran the first Cookin' Connections Activity, teaching young people about where ingredients come from and how to turn them into a good meal. Lastly EYCP had a red carpet night at the Dominion Theatre for Christmas.

Wester Hailes Education Centre recognised two pupils with the Kiran Martin Award for Creative Writing.

National

Kiran's Trust sponsored the trophies for the inaugural Scotish Taekwondo Championships which featured UK and international competitors.

Achievements and Performance of the Charity

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The outgoing Kiran Martin Art Scholarship winner received her graduate payment of £300. The fourth scholarship recipient will be recognised early 2017 due to administrative changes at Larbert High School. Prizes of £50, along with trophies (valued at £33 each), were awarded at Larbert High School's summer prize giving for each of the following categories: creative art and design, photography, music and creative writing.

The payment to Carrongrange School has been deferred to 2017 to assist with their end of term student show. Under the management of Karen McCabe, the following Primary Schools were awarded monies for creative arts and physical education activities: Westquarter, Laurieston, Nethermains, Stenhousemuir, Bowhouse, Carronshore, and Bonnybridge.

Delta Studios received £185 for their work with Forth Valley Sensory Centre.

NRG dance school in Falkirk were awarded £300 towards their annual show.

The Kiran Martin Tackwondo Scholarships at Central Tackwondo Academy were paid out at £400 for ambassador/sustaining (one recipient) and £300 for developing (two recipients of £150 each). The Cadet and Junior Teams received £1,000. The Kiran Martin Indomitable Spirit Prize was awarded (£50 to spend on Tackwondo equipment) along with an engraved nameplate for the trophy (donated by LECS upholstery).

Pittenweem Primary School used a carry over of funds from 2015 for their 2016 Most Creative Pupil Prize. Funding requirements will be reviewed in 2017.

3V2 Soccer Academy received £300 for their European Cup activity and to buy fruit for post-training refreshment.

Space Artworks received £310 to assist with exhibitions and youth workshops.

The Edinburgh International Magic Festival received £1,000 to support the Magic School.

The Edinburgh Young Carers Project received £495 to attend a red carpet event at the Dominion Theatre. Over twenty young carers and their families attended. The Lego Tecnic sets were a gratis donation.

Two prizes of £25 each were awarded to Wester Hailes Educational Centre for creative writing.

The Annual Scottish Young Carers Event received £600 for a performance by Colin Cloud.

In 2016, we had 16 friends (a minimum of £10 donation), of which five make a monthly payment to Kiran's Trust.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year (cont)

The directors recognise the importance of diversifying the ways in which we raise funds, especially with continued financial pressures on individuals. There is a Kiran's Trust 'shop' on eBay, where we sell new or second hand items donated to us. Kiran's Trust is also actively promoting the use of www.easyfundraising.co.uk as a way for people to support while doing their normal online shopping.

The Kiran's Trust website (www.kiranstrust.org) provides information regarding the charity, about Kiran (and some of her artwork), objectives and funding, upcoming fundraising events and access to newsletters and company reports. The Gallery section provides past and current scholars a location to display their work. Additional information outlets are provided via direct mail/email of newsletters, Facebook and Twitter.

The directors express their gratitude to the many individuals who have become Friends, made donations, attended or supported fundraising events. The directors wish to acknowledge the special efforts of Martin Spence and Adam Pender for organising Karting for Kiran, Karen McCabe for Colour Me Rad 5K, students at Napier University for picking Kiran's Trust as their course fundraising project, and Andy Cafferty for continuing to wear his kilt for the year. Jordyn Smith continues to lead Operation Smarties.

The directors also wish to acknowledge the following companies for their donations, services and prizes to the benefit of fundraising events or awards: IDEAS, Central Taekwondo and, LECS Upholstery (in Falkirk area); Wm Christie and Sons, Cork and Cask, St Vincent Bar, and bia bistrot (in Edinburgh); BP Safety Reps and the Andrew platform.

Plans for future periods

The trustees feel there is a good diversity of activities and our future plans are to sustain and to strengthen these existing relationships. Dance has become an outlet in both Edinburgh and Falkirk, we look to further develop this combination of creativity and physical activity.

Structure, Governance and Management

Nature of the Governing Document and constitution of the charity

Kiran's Trust is a company limited by guarantee, and is governed by the regulations set out in the memorandum and articles of association, incorporated on 15 September 2009, and is recognised as a charity by the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator.

The directors meet a minimum of twice a year to conduct the business of Kiran's Trust. The directors, on behalf of Kiran's Trust, award prizes and scholarships and support in the area of creative arts, design, music and writing, and for participation in Taekwondo. The recipients are selected by the administrative staff within those organisations to which Kiran's Trust provides support.

Training of Directors/Trustees

Directors' training in developments affecting the charity's areas of activity is addressed as part of the directors' meetings.

All directors are familiar with the work of the charity. If there are any areas where additional training is required this would be discussed at a directors' meeting and a suitable solution identified.

The major risks to which the charity is exposed and reviews and systems to mitigate risks

The directors have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operation and finances of the charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate their exposure.

Availability and adequacy of assets of each of the funds

The board of trustees is satisfied that the charity's assets in each fund are available and adequate to fulfil its obligations in respect of each fund.

Transactions and Financial position

The financial statements are set out on pages 10 to 15. As stated in the introduction to this report, the trustees consider the financial performance by the charity during the year to have been satisfactory.

The Statement of Financial Activities show net incoming resources for the year of £13,303 (prior year £8,227). The resources expended were £8,032 (prior year £8,479), giving a surplus of £5,271 (prior year deficit £252).

The total reserves at the year end stand at £34,920 (prior year £29,649).

Free unrestricted reserves amounted to £27,945 (prior year £22,724). These reserves are held to ensure that the company's commitments to their scholarships and prizes are able to be fulfilled until such time as additional funding can be put in place.

The designated reserves amounted to £6,975 (prior year £6,925). These are set aside for use during the next financial year to ensure that commitments are met.

Share Capital

The company is limited by guarantee and therefore has no share capital.

Independent Examiner's Report to the trustees of the charity on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31 December 2016

I report on the financial statements of the Charity on pages 10 to 15 for the year ended 31 December 2016 which have been prepared in accordance with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 (The 2005 Act) and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (The 2006 Accounts Regulations) and with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (FRS102), effective January 2016, as modified by the Charities SORP (FRS102), under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out on page 12.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

1 Accounting policies Basis of preparation of the accounts

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (Revised 2005), applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement, on the grounds that it is a small company.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared, on a going concern basis, under the historical cost convention.

Incoming Resources and resources expended

Incoming resources are accounted for on a receivable basis.

Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred.

Governance costs include the general running expenses of the company and consist mainly of those relating to statutory requirements.

Investment Income

Bank Interest received is included on an actual receipts basis.

Taxation

As a registered charity, the company is exempt from income and corporation tax to the extent that its income and gains are applicable to charitable purposes only. Value Added Tax is not recoverable by the company, and is therefore included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

Funds structure policy

Funds are classified as either restricted or unrestricted funds, defined as follows:

The charity maintains a general unrestricted fund which represents funds which are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the directors' discretion to apply the fund.

There is no formal policy of transfer between funds or on the allocation of funds to designated funds, other than that described above.

2 Winding up or dissolution of the charity

If upon winding up or dissolution of the charity there remain any assets, after the satisfaction of all debts and liabilities, the assets represented by the accumulated fund shall be transferred to some other charitable body or bodies having similar objects to the charity.
